November Program

Kirk Klingensmith

Fishing in Florida

We welcome you to join us on Monday, November 7th, when our own Kirk Klingensmith, President of the Twin Tiers Five Rivers Chapter of IFFF, will be speaking about fishing Florida. Kirk has been fishing Florida for over 20 years, and has enjoyed a multitude of different fishing experiences there in fresh and salt water. Kirk will highlight freshwater opportunities for big largemouth bass and exotic species like Miami's peacock bass, Everglades Oscars, Mayan Cichlids, Tilapia, and grass carp. The talk will overview saltwater fly fishing opportunities on beaches, flats, and bays from the Gulf coast through the Everglades. Kirk will share from his experiences which include wade fishing, kayak fishing (during the day and at night), and on boats. The talk will recommend adjustments to your fly fishing approach to transition your game to the salt and overview some of the exciting species to be found on a fly. If you are considering taking a rod to Florida, or want to get started in saltwater, or just want to hear interesting stories of fishing with alligators and pythons for exotics – you don't want to miss this talk. Kirk will also be the featured fly tyer demonstrating patterns useful for Florida saltwater fishing. The fly tying demo starts at 6:30 pm, with the presentation starting at 7:00, at the Big Flats Community Center, 476 Maple Street, Big Flats, NY 14814.

Besides owning his own successful fly tying business (Law Competition Flies), Ethan is a member of Team USA that competes in International fly fishing competitions. Ethan will talk about European nymphing techniques using sighters and other techniques that he finds valuable as well as tips that make his trips more productive. Ethan will also be the featured fly tyer prior to starting his talk.

Gary Kell, IFFF Certified Casting Instructor

Mastering Intermediate Casting Skills

We also want to give a heads-up that the meeting in January of 2017 will be pushed back one week due to the New Year's holiday. On January 9, 2017, IFFF Master Certified Casting Instructor, Gary Kell will be talking about techniques and skills to improve your casting proficiency. Gary was a long-time instructor at the LL Bean Fly Fishing school, and has written for *Fly Fisherman* and other fly fishing periodicals. He lives and teaches fly fishing in the northwestern PA area, and consequently is an expert on fishing streams in central and other areas of PA. His talk will center on mastering what he calls the 5 intermediate skill variables that, when used in various combinations, create most presentation casts and solve many stream-side problems - slack line, curves, tucks, aerial mends, underbrush, limited backcast, wind etc.. More details to come about this talk, but if you want to improve your casting skills, you will not want to miss this one.

February Program – Social Night Dinner

Speaker: Linda Wales, from *A Hope 4 Lyme, Inc.*

Presentation: Lyme Disease Informational Seminar

The speaker for our February 6 Social Night will be Linda Wales, from *A Hope 4 Lyme, Inc.* Linda, a Lyme disease warrior, will be talking about the basics of tick-borne illnesses and prevention. Lyme and other tick-borne illnesses often cause a variety of complications including pains in the muscles and joints, severe fatigue and cognitive issues. Serious health problems associated with the disease can manifest quickly, and can even be fatal. Many people don't know about the disease or that their family could be at risk. As Linda tells it, "I started spreading awareness and support because I didn't know about Lyme disease and I didn't understand or know about ticks, therefore, I got very sick. It is my hope for others to avoid going down the same path." A tick study conducted in 2016 at Mark Twain State Park and Newtown Battlefield showed almost 50% of the ticks positive for Lyme disease.

Tying Glass Bead Flies



This sixty page, hard covered book covers all that is needed to know about materials, hooks, tools and tying methods, plus beautifully illustrated patterns and recipes to tie Glass Beaded flies. Joe leads us step-by-step from simple flies to the more complicated extended bead-bodied streamers. This book has great colored illustrations of both fresh and salt water patterns with some match-the-hatch and attractor flies. This is a great opportunity to try something different at the fly tying bench and on the water. You can purchase glass beads locally from craft stores in our area, plus containers to hold the beads. This book also talks about the correct hook for each specific pattern, an important part of the fly construction.

Metallic P.T. Nymph



Materials List:

Hook: Daiichi 1270, sizes 8-14

Thread: Brown 6/0

Body: 4 to 5 brown or copper metallic beads, medium or small

Tail: Pheasant tail fibers

Wingcase: Pheasant tail fibers

Thorax: Peacock herl

Legs: Tips from wingcase, splayed back

Killer Caddis



Materials List:

Hook: Daiichi 1250, sizes 12-18

Thread: Chartreuse at butt, wine to finish, 6/0

Body: 3 to 5 Killer Caddis iridescent beads, small or midge, depending on hook size, color to suit.

Butt: Antron dubbing, the color of beads

Head: Black, natural fur dubbing

1. Call to Order

Kirk Klingensmith called to order the Business meeting of the TT5R IFFF at 1907 on 10-17-2016 at the American Legion in Corning, NY. 2. Approval of Meeting Minutes and Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report shows an opening balance of a \$3372.00 and a closing balance as of \$3272.21. The treasurer found errors with his financial tracking spreadsheet, which caused discrepancies between this monthly financial report and reports adopted earlier in 2016 since January.
